A note from our Treasurer

Our 2nd Quarter donations are down about \$7,000 as I write this, but we do have another week in May to receive donations, so it may pick up. So far this quarter \$1,873 was given to Pledge to Mission; \$105 to Mission: \$55 to Memory; \$386 to Prayer and Self Denial; \$350 to Wallace Family Life; \$595 to Bethlehem, Columbia; \$215 to Bethlehem, Spartanburg; and \$115 to Killingsworth. Your Executive Board approved a District Budget of \$2,700.00 to be presented at our Annual Meeting. Rock Hill District has completed and passed our annual Audit and it has been sent to the Conference.

Just for our records, our district made our pledge to Mission in 2020 of \$25,223.65. That was awesome. We will keep our pledge to Mission at \$25,000.00 for 2022.

<u>SMR ORDERS</u>: There has been a change in that now, only the special recognition pins may be ordered from National. The processing company will no longer print the certificates that go with the pins. This means that we must find a way to print them ourselves. Some of you may be able to do this, and others will not. So when you send in a pin order to me from now on, please let me know if you need me to print off the certificate and mail it to you. Here is the PDF form.



Keep up the good work and encourage your units to keep sending money to Mission as they can.

Starting June 1st, we will be in the 3rd Quarter. It will end on Aug. 31st, so if you want the awards, you will need to have your monies to me prior to the end of August.


