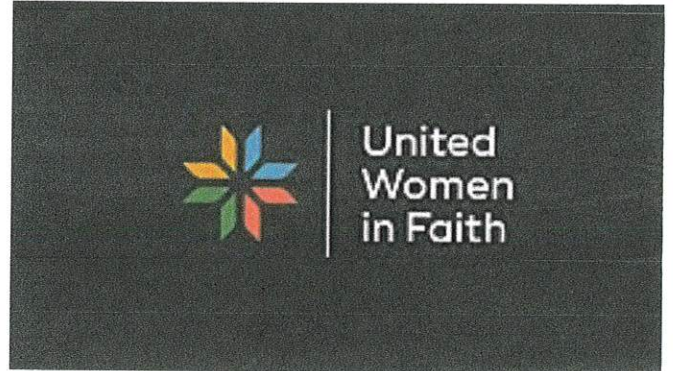

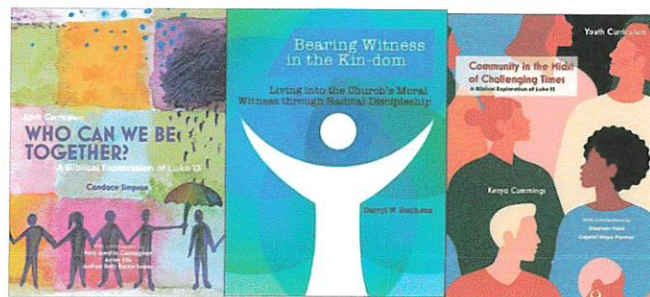

This manual may be updated annually as needed to refine the operations of the event and to reflect current practices. This manual is intended to be used as a tool for effective planning and should reflect the spirit of the collaborative effort embodied in the United Methodist Church.

HOSTESS DUTIES

- The hostess is responsible for identifying date, time, and location for the virtual tea
- The hostess is responsible for securing required technology criteria is met
- The hostess is responsible for identifying a subcommittee to assist with local tea execution
 - a. Decorate table (s) your choice of settings
 - b. Provide food and beverage
- The hostess is responsible for inviting guest to attend the tea party.
- The hostess is responsible for collecting donations on behalf of Killingsworth Home

Here are a few tips that we hope will be helpful to you as you make this event beautiful, enjoyable, and most memorable.

LOCATION AND VENUE

The hostess will identify a location to host the tea. You will want to secure a venue that has ample space for tables and chairs and is equipped with internet, television or screen for view and speakers for audio. You will want to confirm with the facilities manager that they can accommodate the technology requirements. Based on your targeted number of attendees you will need space that would hold enough tables to seat 6-8 at a table.

Potential site recommendations: Church fellowship Hall

TECHNOLOGY REQUIREMENTS

You will want to identify a space that is equipped with the following:

- 1- Large TV Monitor or Screen
- 2- Projector
- 3- Laptop Computer with connections to both projector and sound system
- 4- Ability to download the video file. (*Note streaming is an option however speed can be connected by low connections)

Here is a sample of the tea menu you can consider. Generally, we served tea in three courses, with tea for each.

- First course: scones with jam and clotted cream.
- Second course: petite sandwiches: cucumber with cream cheese, chicken salad, pimento cheese, or petite quiches.
- Third course: petit fours, chocolate dipped strawberries, lemon squares,

TEA SETTING COMPONENTS

First, gather the utensils and accessories needed for the event. Each place setting requires a luncheon-size plate, cloth napkin, fork, butter knife, spoon, teaspoon, teacup and saucer. A water glass and waste bowl may be provided for afternoon tea, as well as a bread plate or dessert plate. Accessories include the tea pot or tea kettle, and a serving knife and serving spoon for any spreads. Milk or cream and sugar cubes should be offered in their own containers, with tongs for the cubes. Finally, provide a tiered tray to hold the edibles. If you do not have a tiered tray there is other method that you can use to create different levels for you edibles.

Just remember to bring your serving dishes. Refer to menu to verify the number of dishes you will need.

PLACE SETTING

In order to visualize the place setting in front of each individual, imagine you are sitting at the tea table facing a luncheon plate directly in front of you. On the left side of your plate, you will see a folded cloth napkin with a fork on top or to the right. On the right side of your plate is the butter knife, serrated edge facing in, along with a spoon, a teaspoon, and then the teacup and saucer to the right of these utensils. The waste bowl and bread plate, if provided, appear at the upper left of your plate. Also if provided, directly above your luncheon plate you will see the special dessert fork and spoon, facing different directions, with the dessert plate right above them. The water glass is placed above the knife. Review the menu to determine if you need to have a knife at each place setting. If you are using spreads for the bread or muffins a spreader will be better.

PLACEMENT OF ACCESSORIES

Other items that will appear at your table must be placed within convenient passing reach to all guests at the party, with the exception of the tea pot. The hostess is expected to pour the tea, so the tea pot and tea kettle are placed with the spout facing her. In traditional tea service, the three-tiered tray containing scones, sandwiches, and sweets would be removed layer by layer from the table as each course was served. You may also provide a finger bowl for rinsing fingertips, and a knife rest for cleanliness and a touch of luxury at each place setting.

PLACE CARDS

There is a time and a place for every effort under the sun. At times, place cards will be appropriate on your tea table. With place cards you can:

- Relieve your guests from the guess-work of where to sit.
- Give your event a friendly but dressy and prepared-for feel.

- Show your thoughtfulness as a hostess, choosing the best for your guests based on previous relationships, personalities, and the possibility of new friendships.

Your place cards can be simply made with your printer or own beautiful handwriting and some pretty paper. Yet creative, theme-based place card holders can add a whimsical touch to your table.

OFFER PARTING GIFTS

One of the fun parts of hosting a tea is to use table accessories that double as gifts for your guest. These are usually theme-appropriate and placed on the tables as part of the setting. If you create place cards they can also be used as a party favor.

TEA PARTY ATTIRE

Tea party attire can be a dilemma for some people. Do you wonder how to dress for an invitation to teatime? What to wear can vary depending on the occasion. Also, it is contingent on whether the affair is traditional or nontraditional; formal or casual. Themes that call for costumes or a certain type of attire are always lots of fun. And what girl, whether little or grown up, doesn't love getting all dressed up once in a while?

Don't feel that you must wear anything special for your afternoon tea. A nice blouse and skirt or pants for the ladies, and shirt and slacks for the men is suitable. For a more formal affair, dresses are appropriate for both girls and ladies. (I would not recommend wearing jeans to teatime!)

Dresses - ladies and girls, find the right teatime dress to suit the occasion - feminine, fun or sophisticated.

🍷 Victorian Dresses - vintage style dresses and the Victorian era are always a favorite theme.

🍷 Hats - a lovely hat gives flair to teatime and provides a certain elegance to the wearer.

🍷 Girls and Ladies Gloves - rarely worn now, gloves for a social function lend a more formal feel.

🍷 Party Costumes - great fun for one and all, younger and older! Go ahead and dress up in one of these favorite theme costumes.

~ *Alice in Wonderland Costume - a perennial favorite. You can't go wrong with Alice attire.*

~ *Queen of Hearts Costume - go ahead and steal all the tarts - you're the queen!*

~ *Mad Hatter Costume - you can get away with acting a little "mad" when you where this costume!*

~ *Teatime Hostess Costume - surprise everyone by greeting your guests in special apparel.*

~ *Princess Dresses - princess dress up makes all women feel like royalty!*

We are again facing a change in the life of the church and in how women live and choose to engage the world in faith. It is again time to take on a new name.

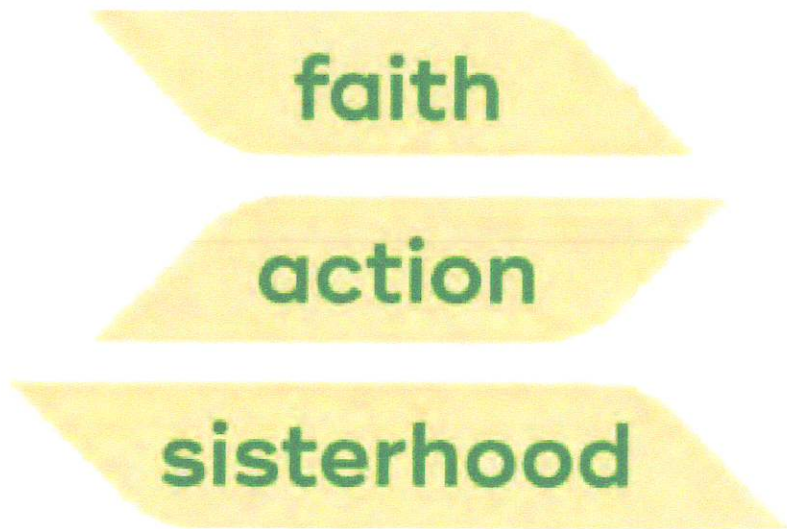
A new name

As United Women in Faith we are a powerful, fearless force driven by God's love and united in sisterhood with a focus on women, children and youth. We act for justice and transform communities. We invite United Methodist and other like-minded

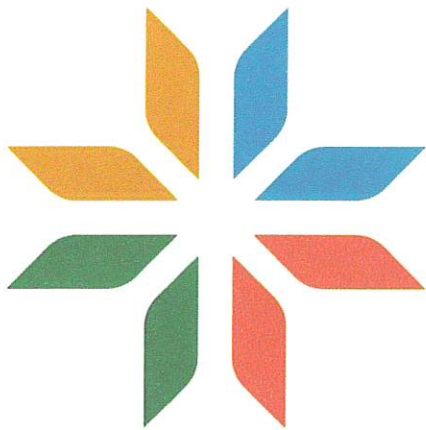


women to join us, because *love in action can change the world*.

Adopting the name **United Women in Faith** and introducing new and improved programs acknowledges the great changes that have occurred in the lives of U.S. women over the past four decades and in the ways they're engaging their faith. It acknowledges the changes you need to continue to grow in your faith and make the differences you want to make.

Methodist Women used in some places, but as we move into the future, together we'll be United Women in Faith.

We remain the official women's organization of The United Methodist Church. We remain the organization training women for leadership, growing spiritually, transforming through education, and providing opportunities for service and advocacy. We remain women in mission who follow God's call for our time.

Our new logo represents the past, present and future of our organization. The symbol refers to our Christian roots. The multicolored pieces of the cross coming together represent the diversity we aim for and the inward and outward reflection we engage in as women of faith. The typography is solid, modern and bold, showcasing our power to support the causes in which we invest.



As United Women in Faith we are a powerful, fearless force driven by God's love and united in sisterhood with a focus on women, children and youth. We act for justice and transform communities. We believe love in action can change the world.

"This is an exciting time for our organization!" said Harriett Jane Olson, CEO of United Women in Faith. "Looking back, we see the through lines for our organization—faith in God and commitment to women, children and youth—and how this has been expressed in different ways at different times, always calling women into action that changed the world. This refreshment opens up new opportunities for us to continue to make that happen."

As of printing, a United Methodist General Conference is scheduled to take place this year. No matter what happens at General Conference, churches will leave the denomination, and the denomination will change. **Our new name lets women know they can remain a part of our organization**, and it lets them know we will not leave them behind. It also lets the church know that we've been on a path of listening and discerning that will help us lead the church into its full potential.

Faith, action and sisterhood

Over the past two quadrennia, the United Methodist Women board of di-

rectors, with input from the United Methodist Women Program Advisory Group, has guided the organization's re-branding work, program innovations and new initiatives. A committee of these leaders created a **new mission statement** for our organization: *United Women in Faith seeks to connect and nurture women through Christian spiritual formation, leadership development, creative fellowship, and education so that they can inspire, influence and impact local and global communities.*

Board President 'Ainise 'Isama'u said the changes express our core values in ways that will excite our members and invite new women to join us.

"I'm confident our members will be excited about these changes. Together we are creating more opportunities for engagement with more women through new programs and updates of long-standing programs that embody our core values. Things change. People change. But God remains, and that continues to be the purpose behind everything that we do in this organization."

Faith, action and sisterhood are our calling cards as we reach out to in-

vite new women to join us on this wonderful journey and find new ways to support one another and women, children and youth. **Faith**, because at our heart and in our soul, we are a faith-driven organization. Our beliefs bring us together. And our spirituality pushes us to do more. United Women in Faith enables women to boldly live our faith and connect to something bigger. **Action**, because our actions have always spoken as loud as our words: Acts of love, acts of faith, acts of change. For more than 150 years, our members have been showing up and getting things done. Together, we're making the world a better place: locally, globally, fearlessly. **Sisterhood**, because we welcome and connect women together. We are on a mission to boldly act and transform communities.

Our new logo features our new name of United Women in Faith next to a Christian cross in muted yellow, blue, orange and green to reflect our forward-looking faith and the diversity of the organization and God's world.

"The wonderful qualities of our beautiful new logo are that the colors and the cross symbol are fresh, open and align with the goals of United Women in Faith to remain modern, inclusive and relevant," said Rae Grant, senior art director for the organization. "It really does embody the goals of the organization and hopefully makes all the members proud and excited to be part of the future of United Women in Faith."

This is indeed an exciting time for our organization, as we move forward into our future. Together, we can do more. Our strengths and steadfast Christian faith are needed now more than ever. Let's stand united as, together, we continue to put love in action. You are our future. Welcome to United Women in Faith! ■

Frequently Asked Questions on United Women in Faith

Are we still a part of The United Methodist Church?

Yes! We are still the only official women's organization of The United Methodist Church, and our legal name will remain United Methodist Women.

What do we call ourselves now?

You are United Women in Faith! It's okay to ease into it; it's a big change. We'll have the new logo ready for download on our new website, and other materials are available there to help us all and transition together.

How were these decisions made?

Our new programs are fruits of the research the national office conducted over the past quadrennium along with prayerfully seeking to discern the times for our organization. The member-elected United Methodist Women board of directors, with input from the program advisory group, has guided the organization throughout this process.

We've conducted surveys, focus groups and interviews with more than 24,000 United Methodists and women of other denominations and Christian traditions. The changes and programs are data-informed and tested to address the needs and life stages of current members and new women.

Will these changes impact me and my local unit?

All of our traditional structures on the conference, district and local levels—circles included—remain intact. These

new tools and programs are additional options available to you and your unit to help you better nurture current members, recruit new women into the organization and manage your unit's finances.

Can we be members if our church leaves The United Methodist Church?

Yes. Changes to the bylaws allow for women to be involved and be leaders in our organization even if they become affiliated with another denomination. Our new name makes our organization more inclusive.

Where can I learn about all of the changes underway?

New Wineskins resources available on the website at uwfaith.org will give you an overview of the changes underway. Changes include the new name, new website, templates for Soul Care retreats, innovations to Mission u and Leadership Development Days, a national membership option, more targeted giving options, new online tools for treasurers and new and improved resources.

What is the New Wineskins Campaign?

United Methodist Women—now United Women in Faith—is again saying yes to being part of what God is doing in the 21st century by creating new and improved ways for women today to gather for faith, sisterhood and action for women, children and youth.
