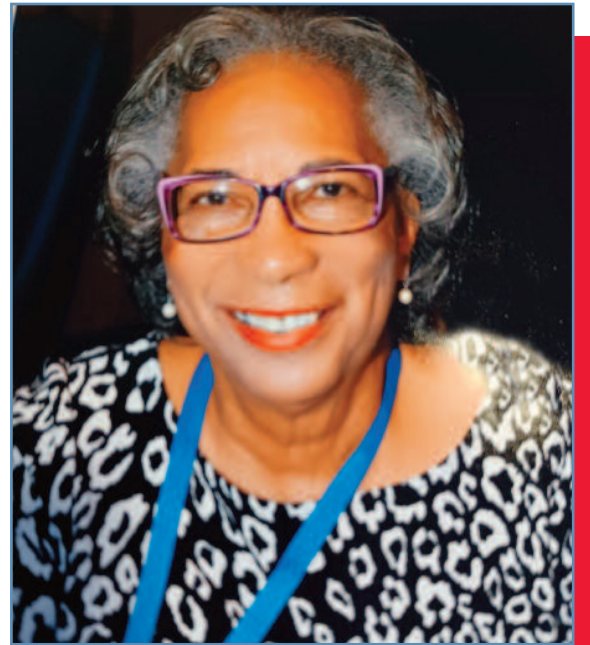

Join the Field Trip to St. Helena Island Penn Center in February

The Conference United Women in Faith Charter for Racial Justice Committee is continuing our campaign of awareness of developers trying to encroach on Black settlement communities in South Carolina. Since our Racial + Environmental Justice event in June, we are happy to report that some of these communities in the Charleston area have gained more protection and developers' applications have been turned down. This was done through much public advocacy for these communities. However, one community in downtown Charleston lost their legal battle, and developers will be taking over and greatly changing their community.

As for the Gullah community in Beaufort County, the Beaufort County Council voted to retain their Cultural Protection overlay zone, which means the developer will be taking them to court in an

attempt to get that overridden. The Gullah community is a unique and vital historic community providing many contributions to our overall history in South Carolina.

Racial Justice Committee has arrangements for a tour of the Penn Center Museum on St. Helena Island on February 15, 2025 at 1:00pm. This tour will take 90 minutes and admission is \$15.00. There is so much history on the grounds to see, maps of the campus are available in their gift shop for \$5.00 for self-guided tours. www.penncenter.org

The CRJ Committee selected February since that is Black History Month. We urge you to invite youth to come and see where significant Black history has taken place in our state. The Conference will pay for their admission fee. We are working on adding other activities during this trip and will keep you informed. We suggest touring around St. Helena Island to see other historic structures, visit a local art store, eat at a local restaurant, and get to know the local people.

There is the Reconstruction Era National Park visitors' center in Beaufort that provides information on the Gullah Geechee Cultural Heritage Corridor. Free tours are offered at some of the locations. You can find more information on this at nps.gov/reer or call 843-962-0039.

Schooler will be joined by Kim Graham, who will serve as Vice President.

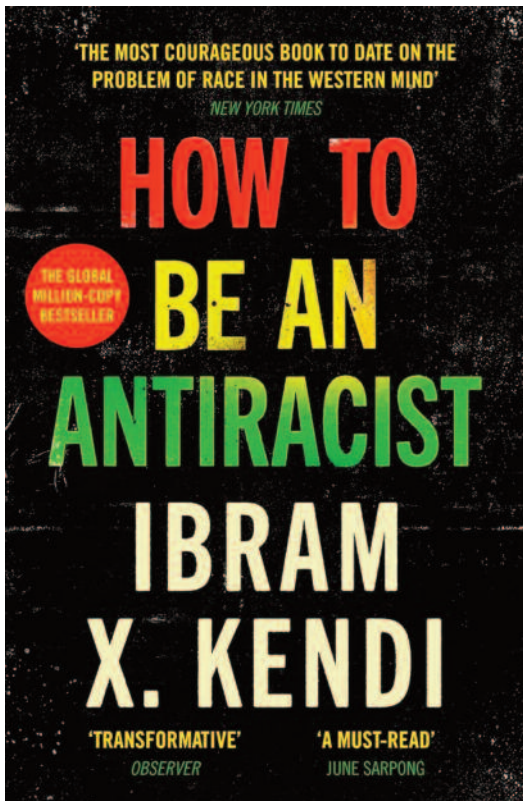

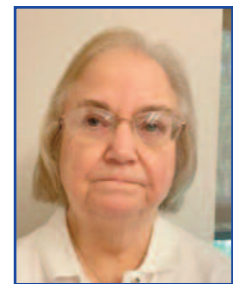
Education and Interpretation Update

Mission Today 2024 is complete and SC Conference had 102 units to report that they completed the required criteria. Orangeburg District had the most units to qualify with 24; Charleston District was in second place with 15; and Anderson and Florence tied for third with 11 each. 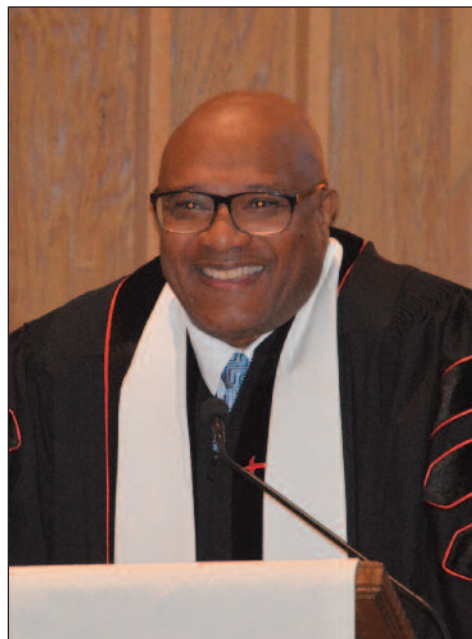
