

Education and Interpretation Update

It was good to see some of you in Aiken at the conference Annual Meeting. When I gave my Mission Today report, Rock Hill District was the leader in units participating. However, with the addition of two last-minute additions to the report, Hartsville District tied them with 14. If you attended on Friday, but did not stay until Saturday, there was a printing error in the program under Marion District in the Mission Today report: please add Surfside and Trinity, Bennettsville.

I hope some of you attended the Killingsworth Gala, Nov. 9. In addition, Bethlehem Center, Spartanburg, celebrated its Special Emphasis Giving Month in October. These are just two of more than 90 National Mission Institutions (NMIs) supported by United Women in Faith. National Mission Institutions are community-based organizations and social service agencies that were

almost exclusively founded by women in the 19th century to serve marginalized communities and populations across the United States. Today, United Women in Faith remains connected to these community centers, colleges, and residences providing vital services in vulnerable communities. National Mission Institutions empower women, care for children, support seniors, educate youth, provide housing for domestic violence survivors, and offer residences for special needs children and vouth. National Mission Institutions also advocate for the women, children, youth, and families in the communities they serve.





Recently we had our first in-person gala in five years and, as the program said, it was "A Night to Remember"!



At the Annual Meeting, I talked all about what you could expect. I spoke about the election as well. There seems to be some questions concerning who, exactly, are being elected. Well, let me see if I can answer some of those burning questions that you have asked and some you may not have thought about.

of other information.

When will the election be held? The election will begin in the morning session on April 20, that Saturday. It will continue while others are attending the morning workshops.

Who attends the election? There will be reserved seating for all voting delegates who have been elected by their conferences. There are other folks who are also voting delegates by virtue of their positions: National Board Directors, PAG, SEJ Leadership Team, a representative from the Deaconesses and Home Missioners, and a few others. Nominees are welcome

to stay and watch the election, but will not have a vote unless they fall into the above categories. EVERYONE is welcome to stay and watch democracy in action—or you can attend your selected workshop.

Who is elected? The new officers for the Southeastern Jurisdiction Leadership Team will be elected to replace the present team. Six will be elected for the National

Board of Directors plus one alternate who will

step in in case someone must drop out during their tenured time on the Board.

PAG members are not elected at this time. A special committee of the Governance

Committee of the National Board will select PAG members, making sure that all conferences are represented by the Board and/or PAG. Any Board nominees who are not elected

to the Board will be added to the slate of

PAG possibilities. All of these nominees were elected by their conferences during their Annual Meetings, with their names sent on to the SEJ Nominations Committee. There will be an on-line booklet of all the nominees and their answers to some burning questions on the website closer to our Event

What does the Board do? Elected members of the Board, meeting twice yearly, vote on legislation that affects United Women in Faith and women, children, and youth around the world. Several years ago you will remember that our organization was rebranded. This was the result of Board work. National and international mission projects write grants requesting

funds to further programming and to possibly repair buildings. Board members vote on that. The Board approves legislation that will be sent to General Conference for possible passage. As changes occur as a result of disaffiliation, changes will probably need to be made in the Constitution and By-Laws of our organization. The moral of the story is that the Board conducts the business of our organization.

What does the PAG do? The Program Advisory Group is the liaison between the National Office and the conferences and districts and local units. It is made up of Directors and Program Advisory Group members named by the special Governance Committee. The jurisdiction presidents are also PAG members by virtue of their position. Meeting by jurisdiction quarterly and with the Board once a year, the PAG is able to see what the Board has decided on and works to get that information down to the conferences. If there are concerns on the conference/district/local level, these concerns are discussed and passed on to National. One of the major issues that we, in our jurisdiction, took on was the line in the program book that quoted the Lord's Prayer as saying, "Our Mother, which art in heaven..." Our PAG wrote a letter to the powers-that-be voicing our concerns. Some jurisdictions had no issue with this translation—but the Bible Belt Southeastern Jurisdiction did. As a result, National has placed a Board member from each jurisdiction on those committees which approve reading program books, program books, Mission u studies, etc., just to make sure that this situation would not happen again—maybe...smile.

I hope this answers some of your questions concerning the election which is a very important part of our Event. I hope you will take time to look at the nominees when Holidays

that information is put on the website. I also hope you will look at all the opportunities you will have as we GET TOGETHER! with women from all over the Southeastern Jurisdiction. It will be a time of fun, fellowship, business, pleasure, and Soul Care.

Thanks for all who have been collecting "G" for God, "J" for Jesus and Jurisdiction, and "L" for legacy dollars. As those bills begin to add up, feel free to cash them in for larger denomination bills, or to write a check to "SEJ Leadership Team UMW." All "G's, "J's" and other

moneys that are not "L's" will be given at the Event to Mission Giving during the

Friday night or Sunday morning Gathering. All "L's" will be given at the Celebration Banquet on Saturday night. Our goal is \$15,000 for

the Event. Thanks to those of you who are such faithful givers, I was able to collect \$733 at our Annual Meeting. It will go with me to Chattanooga. THANK YOU!

As an aside, I will be ending my time on the Executive Committee of the SCCUWF effective April 21, 2024 as that is when I will be relieved of my duties as President of SEJ. After 32 years on the Executive Committee, I have done my time. I will still be around for speaking engagements and to be a study leader for Mission u, however. I thank all who have supported me all these years while seeing things in me that I did not/do not see in myself. As I challenged you at Annual Meeting, look for those shy individuals who sit over in the corner listening. You never know who you might discover.


