





Knowing your target audience can help you determine your starting point! Studies show different age groups prefer different platforms. Hopefully this guide will help you in your approach to engaging social media as a ministry tool.


Gen Z (Ages 18-24): TikTok, Instagram, Snapchat, and YouTube, preference for quick, engaging media.

Millennials (Ages 25-34): Instagram, Facebook, YouTube, and LinkedIn, largest users of social media.

Gen X (Ages 35-49): Facebook, YouTube, Pinterest valuing these platforms for news, community updates, video content, lifestyle, and shopping.

Baby Boomers (Ages 50-64): Facebook primarily for connecting with friends and family. YouTube is also well-utilized for entertainment and educational videos.

Seniors (Ages 65+): lower social media participation, YouTube and Facebook are the most used platforms, mostly for staying connected and accessing content that aligns with their interests.
