Clean Water for School Children in Mississippi

Jackson, Mississippi's municipal water system was damaged with flooding several months ago. They continue to be under a boil water advisory. Even though residents in the black community have been told the water is safe to drink, it comes out of the tap looking brown and muddy. Water fountains at the schools have been covered up to keep the children from trying to drink the polluted water. The South Carolina Conference United Women in Faith wants to help provide bottled water for the schools. They are requesting monetary donations to be sent through your units to the district treasurer (specified for "Jackson Kids' Water") who will send it to the conference treasurer. The deadline for this project is February 14, 2023. Monies will need to be sent to conference by Valentine's Day. Please be generous! Keep Jackson, MS in your prayers. Thank you.
