I will have the complete 2023 list in the *December Gleanings*. I'll also include which ones are in the Richland and Lexington County Libraries. We may read books from 2018 – 2023 this year.

I want to highlight three books from the Spiritual Growth category:

- 1) The Big Deal of Taking Small Steps to Move Closer to God
 - This book by Bishop Vashti Murphy McKenzie, a bishop in the African Methodist Episcopal Church, shows how to develop a stronger relationship with God and an effective spiritual lifestyle by taking small steps that will lead to big changes.
- 2) Daughter of Cana (Jerusalem Road, Book 1)
 - Hired to oversee a wedding feast in Cana, Thomas and Tasmin, twin siblings, meet Jesus when He changes the water into wine. Thomas and Tasmin argue when Thomas decides to follow Jesus. She decides to follow the Nazarene's group and bring her brother home.
- 3) God Unbound
 - This book is about Paul's letter to the Galatians. Paul has given himself to God's mission in the world which is a mission to everyone. The author feels that the God we love is much bigger than we knew and not bound by our theology or tradition. It is time for us to see and know the unbound God.

Now is the best time to begin reading for 2023. As usual, I challenge all of you on the Columbia District Team to complete at least Plan I of the Reading Program this year.

For more information go online to **uwfaith.org**. Go to the Reading Program page and click on the **Reading Program Catalog**. You will find a summary of the Reading Program and requirements for each of the four plans. Also included is a paragraph about each book for 2023.

On the left of the Reading Program page, click on **Previous Reading Program Catalogs** for a chart of all books in this year's program. You may read books from 2018 through 2023.

Books marked as bonus books count as two books in that category. To receive the bonus credit for the spiritual growth bonus books, you must participate in or lead one of the studies. Just reading these books outside of a study group counts as one book.

Several movies also give Reading Program credit. These are: *Hidden Figures, Pushout*, and *The Hate U Give*. These give credit in the category of the corresponding book.

You may receive credit for listening to the *Faith Talks* podcasts. Listening to at least 2 episodes counts as one book in the spiritual growth category.

The Bethlehem Center started the fall season with a busy schedule. Below are a few of the programs I will highlight:

The Highland Early Learning Center: The 3k, 4k, and Head Start programs are well underway, with some spaces still open in the 4k now that they can attend public schools. A fall festival has been planned for October 28 to provide an opportunity to reach out to parents and encourage them to enroll their children.

The S. O.A R. Youth Program: currently has 45 children enrolled in the after-school program, with a goal of 60 for total enrollment. Patrena is very pleased with her afterschool staff, noting the assistance with learning and getting their homework completed.

Senior Programming: Currently the need is for their "Sew to Sow" group. A list was provided for our annual meeting and the next Mission Echo. The Spartanburg units are aware of their needs and items have already been dropped off, along with a gift card.

<u>Upcoming</u>: The board is busy selling coupon books and getting ready for our largest fundraiser "Auction for a Cause" and another event is planned for the end of January with a dinner and entertainment night.

From the administrative side, The Bethlehem Center is updating several educational protocol guidelines, establishing an Advisory Council, new phone lines in the office for better efficiency, and a

new alarm system for safety. Fall assessments at the center will soon be underway.

I have been the mission rep for one year now. In the last year, I have seen firsthand just how hard our director is working through a significant amount of growth with a full-time staff of 14 employees, increasing revenue through grants and continually looking towards researching new funding ideas.

The Bethlehem Center board is celebrating Patrena's work anniversary, 10 years of taking a center that was ready to fold, and now moving forward to the revitalization and positive changes taking place inside the building and out! With the support of our conference and each one of us stepping up our commitment to contribute to our 4 SCC missions, we can continue to improve our communities to better serve women, children, and youth.
