

Some of whom may have relocated before receiving same. I've chosen at random several names and their email addresses. Other names and addresses can be found in the Prayer Guide (formerly called Prayer Calendar). I encourage all UMW units to send a brief note to these people letting them know you support them

with your prayers and giving words of encouragement. Even though the requirement is for "at least 2 people," it would be very supportive if all your members who utilize email chose to participate. Missionaries on US soil and abroad need our prayers and uplifting in these troublesome days. Let
