NEW YORK, N.Y., Mar. 2, 2022: United Methodist Women is now United Women in Faith! The move is part of a refreshing of the organization that includes a new logo and an array of new and improved programs to nurture current members and welcome new women to join to put their love in action on behalf of women, children, and youth.

The organization announced the new operating name in the March-April edition of response, its bimonthly magazine for members, and is launching the rebrand with a new website and Face Book event March 3 at 1 pm ET.

The new programs are fruits of research conducted over the past five years with more than 24,000 United Methodists and women of other Christian traditions participating in the surveys, focus groups and interviews. This input informed the prayerful discernment of staff and elected leaders.

The changes are designed to address the different needs and life stages of current members and new women and expand options for membership and engagement. The new name also aims to welcome current members whose local churches may choose to disaffiliate from The United Methodist Church as well as women of other faith traditions who want to join.

New and innovative programs will be rolled out throughout 2022, including:

- A new, easier to navigate website with a homepage designed to pique new women's interest in United Women in Faith and a special portal set to come online later this year where members can log in to access additional resources.
- A new "All-Access" National Membership Option enabling women to join United Women in Faith via the new website and participate online or in person at local units or larger events Soul Care Retreats, a pilot recruitment program for members and their nonmember friends and new women focused on nurturing women's bodies, minds, and spirits.
- Innovations to Mission u, the organization's longtime spiritual growth and transformative education
 program. Beginning in spring 2022, Mission u will introduce new curricula each year—one for children, one
 for youth and one for adults—all focused on a shared biblical theme. The new Mission u curricula will be
 more adaptable for use in small groups, local churches, vacation Bible schools, retreats, and other settings.
 Through these vibrant, relevant, justice-oriented, and biblically centered curricula, Mission u will continue
 its commitment to learning together for the transformation of the world and expand its impact.

United Women in Faith Press Release continued

"This is an exciting time for our organization!" said Harriett Jane Olson, CEO of United Women in Faith. "Looking back, we see the through lines for our organization—faith in God, love for each other and commitment to putting our faith into action supporting women, children, and youth. These commitments have been expressed in different ways at different times using different names, always calling women to world changing action. This combination of a new look, more accessible resources for members and new ways to participate, positions us for impact in our own journeys and in how we engage the world that God so loves."

'Ainise 'Isama'u, United Women in Faith board president, said the changes express the organization's core values in ways that will excite current members and invite new women to join us.

"I'm confident our members will be excited about these changes," she said. "Together we are creating more opportunities for engagement with more women through new programs and updates of long-standing programs that embody our core values. Things change. People change. But God remains, and that continues to be the purpose behind everything that we do in this organization."

The organization remains incorporated in New York as United Methodist Women and is doing business as United Women in Faith.

United Women in Faith seeks to connect and nurture women through Christian spiritual formation, leadership development, creative fellowship, and education so that they can inspire, influence and impact local and global communities.

Our virtual Legislative Advocacy Days have provided a month of learning and growth for all concerned social advocates. Our February Social Action workshops and knowledgeable speakers have enriched our understanding on critical topics facing South Carolinians and our world today. With over 200 registered for the series, each session has reached many ears and touched many hearts. We greatly appreciate our Bishop Holston opening workshop two with his words of encouragement and support for us and this program. Thank you Bishop. Program Coordinator and Diabetes Prevention Coach Ava Dean, spoke on "Holding out the Lifeline: a Mission to Families" giving great details on diabetes and its serious repercussions. Director of the Appleseed Legal Justice Center Sue Berkowitz, spoke on "Predatory Lending in SC", inspiring our prayers and action to end this harsh practice and provide needed legislative protections. Teen Pregnancy Prevention Specialist and Trainer Carol Singletary, spoke openly on "Parents as Primary Sexuality Educators", giving tips and encouragement for active dialog and involvement with our youth. Kinship Care Program Manager for DSS Tamra Scott-Wilson, closed the series with exploration of family or fictive kinship care to keep children comfortable and in a loving world. All four sessions included a question and answer period. Prayer Warriors closed our time of learning with heartfelt prayer. Thank you to our entire Social Action Team, chaired by Linda Eichenbaum, registrar Rebecca Eleazer and Kim Love Quick Technology for their excellent work in providing this shared time of learning and call to action.

Remember to get registered for Assembly held May 20-22 in Orlando, Florida. The theme is "Turn It Up". Registration will close April 11th. We have 59 members of SCCUWF registered. A few will participate virtually, at a reduced fee, in the comfort of their homes. Over fifty members will be travelling to Florida to experience an Assembly like no other.

Our Education & Interpretation Committee members have news to share. The Mission Today Action Form is updated. You will find the new version in this edition along with details in the E&I report. Also noteworthy is the return of the Craft Room at Mission u. We will be in person at Spartanburg Methodist College on July 21-23 for Mission u study and fellowship. The Craft Room will be open. We are seeking both donations of handmade goodies and eager shoppers. All proceeds go to our four SC Mission Projects. Please encourage your fellow crafters to be busy preparing handmade creations and donations we can offer for purchase.

From the Desk of the President Continued

Together we will recognize and celebrate our Fifty Year Anniversary this year. Our first South Carolina Conference United Methodist Women President Mrs. Connie Byrneside served from 1972 -1976. The newly formed UNITED Methodist Women, keyword UNITED, began in 1972. Her words in the 1984 Voices From the Recent Past pamphlet explain the history at that time. "The White Methodists in South Carolina were organized in 1785 and the Black Methodists in South Carolina were organized in 1866. South Carolina has the largest percentage of Black Methodists of any conference. When early meetings were held, the designation of Conference '85 and Conference '66 came into being. While there had been cooperation and shared activities for some time, it was necessary to insure the continued success of Kingdom building, providing opportunities to share leadership and for the South Carolina Conference to function as a loving and reconciled people of God. "The Plan of Merger" called for all elected leadership to be based on the ratio of our people-75% white and 25% black. This we did and in 1972 we celebrated the merging of all our Methodist work." In closing she wrote "My prayer for the years ahead is that we unite our minds in understanding, and our hearts in ever deeper devotion and commitment, that our joy in service might become a convincing expression of our goal to achieve greater oneness with the Church universal." Let us today, fifty years later, renew our commitment and those ideas of unity and love for all in South Carolina. A simple plan for Remembering Our Fifty Years United in Faith is placed in this edition. Everyone can participate through reflection, prayer, giving and remembrance from March 15 to August 15, five months for fifty years. Both Individual and Unit forms are in this edition. Let us NOT forget the unity sought in 1972. We honor and share the love of our foremothers in remembering the merger and celebrating fifty years as one.

We await the roll out of the 2021 Membership Census. Our United Women In Faith National provides that survey. We do not have it, not yet. We look for it soon, very soon. Please continue to hold onto your membership numbers for 2021, UWF unit membership count on January 1, 2021 and December 31, 2021. We hope to remain the largest conference in membership count and number of units through robust participation in the census. Let us remain ready.

Be sure to read the article on the Legacy Fund and a new South Carolina Every Member Giving Campaign. Your support is needed to reach a goal of \$10,000 in donations. Remember March 23rd Day of Giving which marks our start as a group of women organized for mission back in 1869.

Mark your calendar to attend our free virtual Spiritual Growth Event, Spartanburg District hosts, Saturday April 23rd at 10:00 am. The theme is "Surrounded in Prayer". Our keynote speaker is lay servant Annie Crocker of Beaumont United Methodist Church.

Save the date for our free virtual Come Together Be Together, Charleston District hosts, Saturday May 25that 10:00am. The theme is "Surrounded in Love". Several fun workshops will complete the day which opens with song and keynote speaker.

Many great articles are in the Mission Echo. Please read them all. Engage in the work we do. Invite others along!

Wallace Family Life Center Updates

The Wallace Family Life Center held a Summer Camp. Children received nutritional information and can now name all food groups. The Fire Department made a visit to teach them fire safety. The Marlboro County Sheriff also came out to talk to the students. Mrs. Rose Bright taught about gardening skills from the Sunflower Garden Club.

The Wallace Family Life Center held an After School program where we have an average of 12 students per day. Children are picked up by WFLC bus and transported to the Center where they receive a hot snack and are assisted in doing their homework. Students are then transported home by the Center.

Adult Education classes are held on Wednesday. The teacher provides educational activities to adults in class. After receiving instruction students are served lunch and then transported home.

The Wallace Family Life Center continues to strive to meet the needs of the Wallace Community by providing food to those in need. The Wallace Family Life Center held a food giveaway on November 20, 2021. The Center served 35 families with 3 bags of food per family.

The Wallace Family Life Center has begun to open its door to Tri-County Mental Health. Tri-County meets here every Monday 9:00am to 4:00pm. They are reaching out to residents in the Wallace area that have mental health.

We are so thankful to the United Women in Faith and those formerly known as United Methodist Women, churches and individuals for their support of the Wallace Family Life Center and enabling such useful activities to be held in our community.

Bethlehem Center – Spartanburg

I was fortunate to become the representative at an exciting time for the Bethlehem Center. Our local unit had just donated to the Lending Library over the summer, and by early fall I got to see the books in use, meet the new hires, and tour the new Highland Early Learning Center!

The first board meeting I attended in the fall gave me a good overview of the current staff realignments, training, positions open, and hear from the new Operations Director. Patrena Mims, Director (10 years), discussed 2022 goals. All of the staff at the Bethlehem Center are fully vaccinated and boosted, which in turn keeps absences and illnesses down. They are involved with new partners in the community, and remain grounded in the importance of serving the community through support and service, increasing or adding more programs are not the answer, but to educate families to not just survive but thrive.

The Senior Wellness Program continues to target about fifty seniors with Active Living Arts and Crafts, Sewing to Sew, Soul Food Bible Study, and Day Out events. The After School program is focusing on new goals and Summer Camp plans are already underway. The Center has relaunched its partnership with Bridge Builders, a mentoring program for young men. In my next report I will have more information on some of the programs after my visits.

I look forward to serving as the mission representative for the Bethlehem Center with many of my UMW sisters. Missions never stop. Our mission work can continue without ever having a meeting, communication is key. Whether it is monetary or non-monetary, our children, youth, and seniors need our help at all 4 of our centers. We are called because we know what it means to do God's work in the world, and now is the time to act and reach out with our circles to demonstrate our faith, hope, and love in action.

Our SC Social Action District Coordinators will also continue to pay attention to Quality Education and Expanded Physical and Mental Health Services Access as legislative issues for 2022.

Our selected SC Statewide ACTION focus for 2022 is PREDATORY LENDING in all its many forms. We will encourage Districts and Local Units to become informed, to advocate for, and to distribute information concerning this practice that unfairly targets the most financial vulnerable citizens.

We are mid-way through an excellent Legislative Advocacy Day program and our second vital session featured SC Appleseed Justice Center Director, Sue Berkowitz, who gave us a tutorial about the scope and effect of Predatory Lending in South Carolina.
