

# PREDATORY LENDING CAP INTEREST RATE BILL S.518

EVERY SOUTH CAROLINIAN
DESERVES ACCESS TO FAIR CREDIT!

IT IS TIME TO CAP INTEREST RATES IN SC AT 36%!

Currently there are **no limits** on the rates of interest and fees that Supervised Lenders (auto title and high-cost installment lenders) can charge in South Carolina. Supervised Lenders must simply file the highest rate they want to charge each year with the SC Department of Consumer Affairs. **In 2021, the highest rate filed by a Supervised Lender was 950%** - up from 600% in 2017. In addition, **payday lenders generally charge 395% APR** for their short-term loans.

while these loans are marketed as easy access to quick cash, a triple-digit interest rate can quickly create a **debt trap cycle** that borrowers cannot escape. When loan payments become unmanageable, borrowers may have their cars repossessed or their credit rating destroyed, making it difficult to secure housing. In addition, high-cost lenders target people on fixed incomes, people of color, and people facing poverty. **Let your senator know that all South Carolinians deserve just lending!**

> increasing and, with a full house, this translates into increased operating expenses for us. We applaud our staff for stretching your donations as much as possible, but this is not easy for them.

> As I mentioned last time, we do have some serious property concerns that we must take care of and this is especially expensive. Our house is an historic property in a district of historic homes. Exterior repairs must be competed with the same materials and workmanship as they were originally. This means that our leaky porch roof must be repaired with slate installed by artisans who know the material – expensive! After the leak is repaired, we must take

care of the other damage caused by the leak. This will involve repairing plaster on a column.

With these things said, we do need for you to be as generous as you possible can with us this year. We appreciate all of your

donations, and we work diligently to stretch our funds as far as possible.

Another thing that we need at this time is active board members. Most of our meetings are zoom (3rd Thursdays of each month). We need participation from women and men who have a heart for promoting our work. If you are a gifted speaker – or have financial expertise – or know things about human resource management – or have a desire to do what you can to help our women and our staff, we need you to talk to you about this opportunity. 
