

Greetings South Carolina United Women in Faith! For 153 years, members of the United Women in Faith have taken the risk of being in the middle of mission action. They have joined the ministry of Jesus in God's mission, like the women in Luke 8:1-3 (NIV): After this, Jesus traveled about from one town and village to another, proclaiming the good news of the kingdom of God. 

On May 6, 2023 Wallace Family Life Center received a freezer as a donation from Ebenezer UMC Outreach Ministry - Rev. Marvin Kern is the Pastor. Our Summer Camp began on May 12, 2023 with 15 children in attendance. Linda Honeycutt from Philadelphia UMC in Fort Mills, SC

visited the center to deliver school supplies from her United Women in Faith unit.

On August 4, 2023 former: Board of Directors Chairman Katie Harrington and Interim Director Linda Sanders prepared back to school supplies for students in the Wallace area. On August 7, 2023 50 bookbags were given out.

Wallace Family Life Center has partnered with other organizations such as Wallace School Elementary Parent :

Educator Takeshia Harrington for Title I Parent Workshop; Marlboro County Coalition for Family Enrichment; Marlboro County First Step; Palmetto Goodwill and

Bennettsville/Cheraw Area Cooperative Ministry.

The center has added two new programs, Line dancing with 20 ladies and one gentleman

participating every Wednesday since October 2023, and an exercise class that meets on Thursdays with 10 ladies participating. We continue to have the Adult Education class on Wednesday from 9:00am-12:00 noon and serve a hot lunch to the participates. The after-school program meets Mondays-Thursdays. The mini bus is transporting these participates to the center and back home for these programs.

Charter for Racial Justice Event

Please plan to participate in our second online Racial + **Environmental Justice** event scheduled for June 22, 2024 at 10:00am. Our conference United Women in Faith Charter for Racial Justice Committee has received a \$500 grant from National UW Faith to provide a program and a follow-up project specific to a racial justice issue in our state. We are planning to highlight the plight of the Gullah/Geechee community on St. Helena Island who are dealing with developers trying to build golf courses and a gated community near their countyprotected community.

We hope to have a guest speaker from the Penn Center, and the attorney from the South Carolina En-

vironmental Law Project who is representing the Gullah/Geechee Sea Island Coalition. Those who attended this event last year



got to hear from an attorney with the SCLEP who was helping traditionally Black communities with water issues in South Carolina. He gave an eye-opening report of those issues and how they had addressed them.

With the National United Women in Faith grant, we are also required to hold a follow-up activity. The first part of 2025 we are planning a visit to the Penn Center at St. Helena Island. We will be inviting our Limitless members to join our regular members in touring the facility to learn more about it and perhaps bring supplies for the childcare center on campus. Some may want to take a side trip to Charleston to visit the International African American Museum.

We are hoping to bring more awareness to the vulnerability of historically Black communities being taken over by developers in our state. Join us to learn how you can get involved.

This will count as a Diamond Unit activity.

Interrupt the School-to-Prison Pipeline Campaign

The school-to-prison pipeline is a term describing how children and youth of color are rerouted and funneled away from educational success toward the criminal justice system when they are overpoliced and punished in schools.

To successfully interrupt the school-to-prison pipeline, we must resist efforts to criminalize children of color and move toward comprehensive, community-rooted solutions that offer genuine safety for all children. Archives are the collections of items that confirm the history of our organization. Our conference archives are stored with those of the SC UMC in the library at Wofford College. At the last officers training event, I gave each district representative a list of the items from their district which are stored there. I have also shared with the executive board an inventory of all UMW items stored in the Wofford Library.

As we begin filing away UWF historical records there has been a change in how we are asked to submit them. Dr. Phillip Stone, the conference archivist, has requested whenever possible we send electronic copies of documents for storage at Wofford. That's as simple as emailing a copy of directories, newsletters, program books from events, etc. to him. This should help us in adding to the archives in a timely manner instead of having to take boxes of paperwork to Wofford. It also helps with the storage space issue.

Dr. Stone's staff will want to organize these documents so researchers can easily access them. Therefore, please identify your documents by name and level. Example: *Anderson District UWF Directory 2024*. Pictures are always welcome. However, it's important that the people are identified with the name of the event, conference or district and date.

Our goal is to save our history AND to make it easy to retrieve when needed.

Preserving History

This year [2023] United Women in Faith from around the nation moved for mission. Together we put love into action by walking, running, doing yoga, Zumba, chair exercises, knitting, dancing, and finding many creative ways to move together and raise funds to support the many vital programs made possible by gifts to mission.

Heidi Careaga, United Women in Faith Finance Committee chair, said, "It doesn't matter how you move; you just move! It is healthy for your mind and body and can also be healthy for our organization. I am inspired by Philippians 3:12 (CEV): 'I have not yet reached my goal, and I am not perfect. But Christ has taken hold of me. So I keep on running and struggling to take hold of the prize.... I run toward the goal, so I can win the prize of being called to heaven. This is the prize God offers because of what Christ Jesus has done.' I am reminded to move toward the goal of what God has for us now and for the future."

Many conferences, including the Missouri Conference and Michigan Conference, continue to move mission forward by holding mission walks and other events in their conferences.

The Great Plains Conference leadership team held its Move 4 Mission event on June 23. This activity included an obstacle course that highlighted "where Mission money goes." The stations included "Shoot for the STARS" – the five areas of giving; "Walk a Mile in My Shoes" – regional missionaries; "Bowl Me Over" – National Mission Institutions; "Use Your Noodle" – climate justice and mass incarceration; and "13 Steps" to sustainability.

Each had a physical activity and bonus points for answering questions on each subject area. They challenged themselves and one another with the theme, "Moving Mountains for Mission."

Staff members at the United Women in Faith National Office participated in a month-long Move 4 Mission walk. Director of Development Cecilia Malm said, "I participated in Move 4 Mission with my colleagues because for me it is about taking steps – taking steps to educate and equip women leaders, both present and future; taking steps to support local communities and international partners; taking steps to join together with my sisters in faith; and taking steps to keep my body healthy! I hope you will join me in moving forward today toward a better future for women, children, and youth."

We celebrate and give thanks for a sisterhood of bold, courageous, mission-focused, and loving women. As we look to the new year, let us think of more ways we can continue to move the mission of United Women in Faith forward. [from uwfaith.org]




