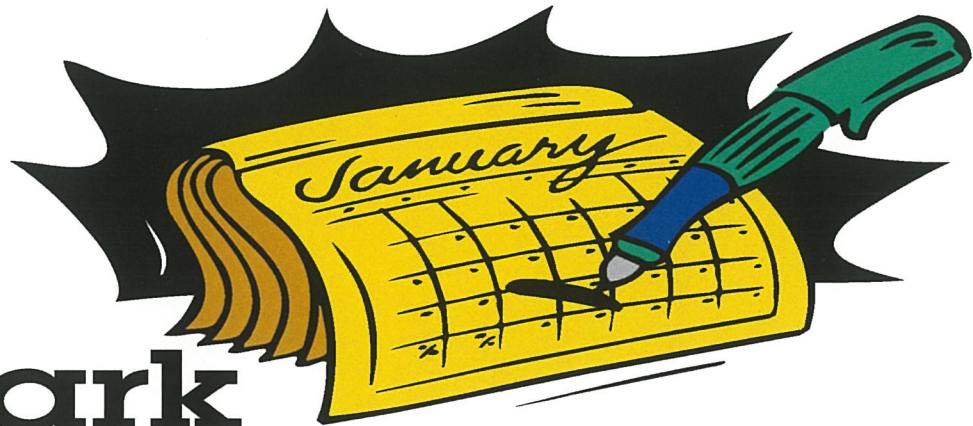

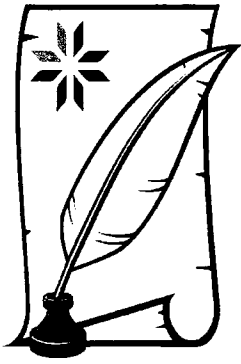

For Anderson District Unit Secretaries that are new, here is an easy tip about names, positions and when to use them:

Remember that your minutes can last for many years, so it must be clear to future readers who's who. When writing minutes, the first time you use a name with a position, put the position either before or after the name, i.e., *Jane Smith, Membership Nurture and Outreach Mission Coordinator*. After that, if Jane Smith's name comes up again in the meeting, just use her name, not her position. Do that with all the people with positions each time you take minutes.

Titles are another matter: always use their title, i.e., Dr., Rev., Professor, President, etc.

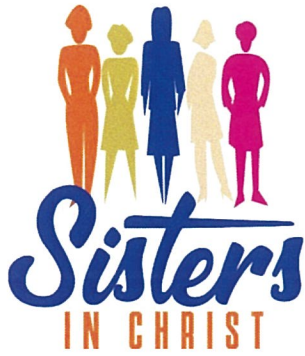

Educational Resources: Reading Program

Do you enjoy learning new things? Do you like to be challenged to think about things in new ways? Do you like to be soothed into relaxation and sleep? If you answered any one or more of these questions with “yes,” there are books, movies, podcasts, and voices from the field that will interest you.

The fewest reading program requirements are for Plan 1. To complete Plan 1, choose just one book from each of five categories (Spiritual Growth, Education for Mission, Social Action, Nurture for Community, and Leadership Development). In addition to traditional books these can also be a Faith Talk, movie, or Voices from the Field to read, listen to, or view. Just keep a record on the Reading Program Form and turn the form in to me by August 31st.

In Plan 2, choose 2 books per category to read. Everything else is the same as for Plan 1.

In Plan 3, after completing the requirements for Plan 2, the next 5 books may be from any category. You will complete a total of 15 books in this plan. Everything else is the same.

In Plan 4, after completing Plan 3, complete 5 additional books for a total of 20. These 5 books may also come from any category.

Don't forget to check out bonus books! They count as 2 each. And remember that children's and youth books are also valid choices. Many of the books are available free from your local library and from the South Carolina State Library. Some books are also part of Kindle Unlimited.

One book I am currently reading and recommend is “What Can I Do? My Path from Climate Despair to Action” by Jane Fonda. In it Fonda clearly explains The Green New Deal, and many environmental issues surrounding climate change. As you might guess from the title, she also suggests concrete ways we might advocate for a healthier planet.

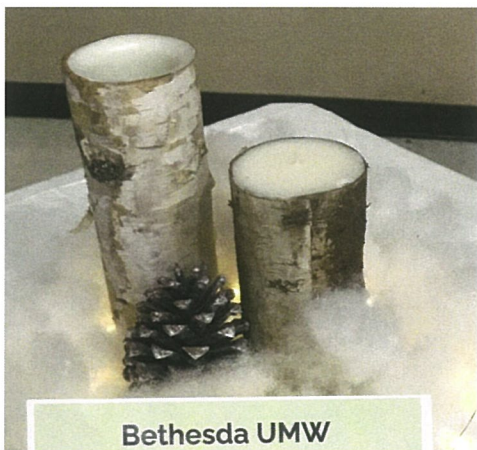
We look forward to hearing from you!

We started by comparing two musical versions of the Lord's Prayer - one traditional and one modern. We also compared several different translations, including the original Aramaic. and discussed how different words could change how we react.

4. *Supply each member with a copy of the *Charter for Racial Justice*.
5. *Present a program on racial justice/human rights from the UMW Program Book.
6. Participate in a UMW Social Action/Human Rights Mission Study.
7. Give a report to the unit about an experience of attending a musical or theatrical performance by persons of a different race, culture, or ethnic background.
8. Send at least one member to Legislative Day.
9. Participate in postcard writing to encourage legislation favorable to the economically deprived or challenged.
10. Experience worship, Bible study, or UMW unit program/activity with an ethnic group different from your own.
11. Attend or host an international hosting party, culture fair, or other international event.
12. Participate in a Bible study on racism.
13. Celebrate Black History month in February.
14. Suggest and plan with your pastor a pulpit exchange with a pastor of another race.
15. Plan an event with a unit of a different race or ethnic background (a celebration, worship, Vacation Bible School, etc.)

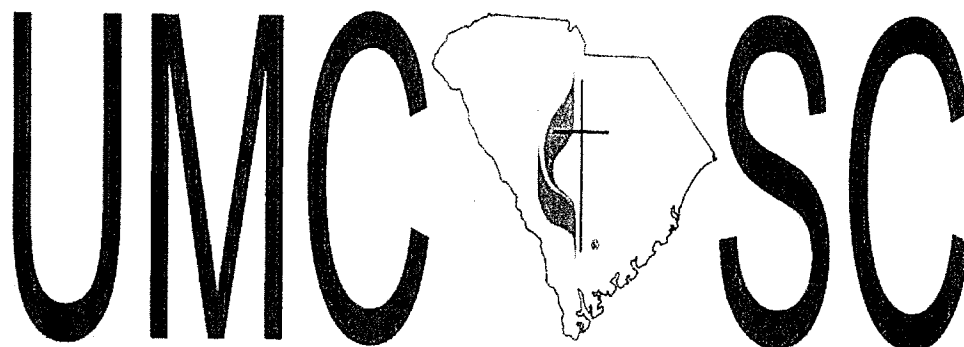
