



Please read the following and respond to it:




I know that some groups will have new treasurers in 2022. You are welcome to call or email me with questions. I will help in any way I can.

Legislative Advocacy Days 2022

Our FREE Virtual Legislative Advocacy Days will be held on various days in February, 2022 and available via Zoom!

Our 90-Minute Workshops will feature knowledgeable Speakers on a variety of topics that address our South Carolina United Methodist Women's focus for this very important year. The Covid Period has changed the ways that we live, worship, and connect with others. Unfortunately, the Pandemic has also multiplied the many challenges faced by our most vulnerable brethren. The Workshops have been planned to provide for an introduction, a 60-Minute Presentation by an expert, followed by a Q & A session to address participant questions. The UMW Tech Team also plans to record the four Workshops for future use and will manage the computer aspects of this delivery. Workshop topics will include PREDATORY LENDING, SC PUBLIC HEALTH ISSUES, KINSHIP CARE VIA DSS, and CRIMINAL JUSTICE REFORM.

Mission Projects & Their Special Emphasis Months

FEBRUARY

Wallace Family Life Center, Bennettsville, SC is a family oriented facility whose mission is to provide educational, cultural, recreational, and religious programs to enrich the lives of the people that live in the Wallace/Bennettsville, SC communities. They currently offer the following programs: Adult Education for those desiring to complete their high school education; Arts & Crafts classes for adults to engage in various projects; Homemakers' Club to explore and discuss relevant issues; After School Program Tutoring and Enrichment, operating Monday-Friday; Summer Reading Program/Children Defense Fund Freedom Schools program for twenty-five to thirty scholars during the summer months, provides learning in a safe and fun environment; Youth Council for youths ages 12-18, to help them to become more active citizens in the community; One week of Vacation Bible School at the end of the Summer Reading Program.

APRIL

<u>Columbia Bethlehem Community Center, Columbia, SC</u> is a historic multi-service agency now serving residents of the Riverview Terrace and Broad River Terrace communities in Columbia, South Carolina. Their vision statement is as follows: We envision that the Columbia Bethlehem Community Center will be the premiere community center for children and families in the Midlands. Their mission statement is: To educate and enrich the lives of individuals and families in the Midlands to help them achieve their own success. The following programs are offered: After-school tutoring (Monday & Wednesday), Summer Feeding Program; Youth Film Camp (children ages 10-14) and Kids for a Better Community Summer Ca

SEPTEMBER

Killingworth Home, Columbia, SC provides residential care for women in crisis situations. The home offers a peaceful, safe, loving, but truth-telling, and disciplined environment where residents begin the long hard journey of working with God to become the wholesome adults they are called to be. Residents work with trained, experienced staff one day at a time — sometimes one hour at a time — to stay clean, stay out of trouble, and learn various life-skills to care for themselves and others as grown-ups. They come from prisons, from alcohol and drug treatment facilities, from psychiatric hospitals, from abusive even violent homes, from the streets, from homelessness and hopelessness. At Killingsworth residents live 24 hours a day, seven days a week with people who not only love them, but tell them the truth in love, discipline them, encourage them, support them, teach them and advocate for them.

NOVEMBER

Spartanburg Bethlehem Community Center – Spartanburg, SC is a multi-service agency providing an array of programs to residents in Spartanburg County. The Center's day care facility has the capacity to serve 130 children between the ages of two and five. The outreach department facilitates client-centered referrals, provides emergency assistance with food, electrical, heating and rental payments as well as coordinates self-improvement focused programming and remedial academic GED preparation classes. The community services department provides numerous programs related to afterschool tutorial services, fine arts (dance, drama, piano lessons and art), sports and recreational activities, scouting, seasonal camping, primary prevention and leadership programs for community youth. Programming for adults includes Bible studies and fellowship, nutritional programs, sewing and craft classes. A computer lab is maintained for all program participants and community residents. The health clinic provides emergency, routine and preventive medical services to community residents.
