

Hello Friends,

I am the campus minister for the **Greenwood Wesley Fellowship.** the Greenwood District's campus ministry serving the students of **Lander University** and **Piedmont Technical College (PTC)**. Campus ministries have become an integral part in the lives of college students and in the life of the local church. Many United Methodist ministers (myself included), missionaries, and religious scholars report having an active involvement in a collegiate campus ministry.

Our ministry aims to foster compassion, community, and curiosity about student faith development in the Lander and PTC communities. While our emphasis is distinctly Wesleyan, we welcome all students of all backgrounds, regardless of demographics or differences. Every Tuesday, we gather at 6:30 pm for food, praise and worship, Bible study, prayer, conversation, and fellowship. In addition to our weekly meetings, once a semester we offer spiritual retreats, which gives students a place for even deeper spiritual reflection and growth. Our ministry also believes in embodying the love of Jesus Christ by serving throughout the Greenwood community and beyond.

On the night before freshman move-in day at Lander University, Greenwood Wesley Fellowship participated in a walk around campus, praying for the dormitories to become homes and also praying for other important places on campus. We also prayed for students, professors, administration, support staff, and campus leadership. The result was a sense of peace and new community together as the body of Christ. We also pray for the students and faculty of Piedmont Tech as well. The GWF board and I are making plans that will meet the needs of our students. This is why I am contacting you.
