

She and her husband, Willie, returned to Newberry following retirement. She was very active in mission work and other areas of the church and community. Sadly, Han-

nah passed away very unexpectedly only twelve days after receiving this award.

The service was closed with a beautiful benediction pronounced by retired minister, Rev. Ada Charles, also a UWF member.


