Education For Mission

Susan Angeline Collins -With a Hallelujah Heart

For more than three decades, African – American missionary Susan Angeline Collins made a difference in the lives of countless African women and children, Some orphaned and homeless and others escaping early marriage. Collins overcame economic, educational, gender and racial, religious and other obstacles surrounding Africa's colonization to serve as a missionary, leader, teacher, nurse, construction manager and surrogate mother to "her girls." **Bonus Book**

Leadership Development

All We Can Save: Truth, Courage and Solutions for the Climate Crisis

Named one of the best books of the year by Smithsonian magazine, *All We Can Save* illuminates the expertise and insights of dozens of diverse women leading on climate in the United States scientist Journalist, farmers, lawyers, teachers, activists, innovators and designers across generations, geographies and race – and aims to advance a more representative, oriented and solution – oriented conversation on the climate crisis.

Nurturing For Community

Together: The Healing Power of Human Connection in a Sometimes-Lonely World

In this groundbreaking book, the 19th surgeon general of the United States. Vivek Murthy, makes a case for loneliness as a public health concern – a root cause and a contributor to many of the epidemics sweeping the world from alcohol and drug addition to violence to depression and anxiety. Loneliness, he argues, is affecting not only our health but also how our children experience school, how we perform in the workplace and the sense of division and polarization in our society.

Social Action

<u>Cousins: Connected Through Slavery, A Black Woman and a White Woman Discover Their Past</u>—What happens when a white woman, Phoebe contacts a black woman, Betty saying she suspects they are connected through Slavery? Revealed to be cousins, they commit to a path of reconciliation. Each tells of her dramatic story, from Betty's experience as one of the first Black children to attend her desegregated school to Phoebe's eventual question to Betty: "how do I begin to repair the harms? Piercingly honest, the book includes a working reparations project that the women conceived together.

Spiritual Growth

Who Can We Be Together?: A Biblical Exploration of Luke 13

In this Mission U adult study, Candance Simpson brings participants deeper into Jesus' teaching in Luke13 to explore what it means to be in community. As Simpson notes. "For followers of Christ 2,000 years later, it's important for us to sit with the range of emotions we have in response to these words. It is not easy to build and sustain communities, especially when there are forces that drain us, and even push us to act uncharacteristically. And yet we are called to act on the most ethical principles of our faith so we can witness the kingdom of God on earth. **Bonus Book**
