In case you need them for review, I am re-printing the book reviews that I included in the last issue of *News A Plenty*—hope these are helpful!



<u>Nurturing for Community</u>- *Maid: Hard Work, Low Pay, and a Mother's Will to Survive* by Stephanie Land explores the lives of the working poor through one single mother. Forced to work as a housekeeper and survive on food stamps to support herself and her young daughter. This is a story of overworked and under paid Americans. Highly

Social Action- *The Nickel Boys* by Colson Whitehead. A biography. Two young boys finding themselves in a reform school called the Nickel Academy. Trapped in a chamber of horrors. This took place in Tallahassee in 1960 and the school has warped the lives of thousands over its 111 years of operation.
