### **Introducing United Women in Faith!**

After five years of research, United Methodist Women launched a new name on March 3- United Women in Faith. According to Sue Owens, South Carolina United Methodist and president of the Southeastern Jurisdiction United Women in Faith, as well as a member of the organization's Program Advisory Group, the group has changed its name more than 25 times throughout its 153-year history.

It started as the Methodist Woman's Foreign Missionary Society in 1869 and also included the Woman's Missionary Association and the Woman's Home Missionary Societies. In 1972, United Methodist Women first became the women's mission organization as part of The United Methodist Church's Board of Global Ministries, and in 2012, the UMC's General Conference voted to make United Methodist Women autonomous.

The corporate name of the organization will continue to be United Methodist Women "doing business as United Women in Faith." There will be little changes in basic structure -with the work of the Treasurer being the same—and United Women in Faith will continue to be governed by the *Book of Discipline*. missional focus will continue to be women, children and youth.



Two years later, at the height of a plague quarantine a young Methodist rescues Chun and places her in a home for abused and trafficked girls.

<u>Leadership-</u> Speaking Well: Essential Skills for Speakers By Adam Hamilton The thought of speaking in public strikes fear in the hearts of many. But we are often called on to speak, teach, preach or make presentations in our work and personal lives. This pocket guide offers 19 powerful tips and tactics that lead to excellent speaking in any setting.

<u>Social Action-</u> For Such a Time as This: Hope and forgiveness after the Charleston Massacre by Sharon Risher - Plunged into the depths of mourning, anger and shock the Rev.
