Multiple volunteers are needed for every breakfast, lunch, and dinner shift to help serve anywhere from 150 to 250 meals to our grateful clients. Meal shifts are 1.5 hours, and most volunteers typically serve a meal shift once a week or once a month, but one-time opportunities are sometimes available as well.

Volunteers interested in this position are expected to wear long pants, no exposed underarms, closed-toe shoes, and a smile!

I found an old *response* magazine from 1978, and it was interesting to see the similarities and differences with our *response* today. In 1978 there were 12 issues. There was a Bible study, a Responsively Yours page, articles about community and the upcoming assembly, a skit, and an index of articles and their issues from the year's magazines. There was a report from the 1977 Schools of Christian Mission. A total of 14,893 attended from all the jurisdictions. The Southeast Jurisdiction had 3,482. SC had 402. How does that compare with today?

Of course, today's *response* is very colorful and has a Bible study. It has a section call BRIGHTLIGHTS with articles about activities and projects from local units. There is also a Chinese page and a Spanish page.

Please continue to read the 6 issues of response as part of the Reading Program.

Each month I plan to highlight several books from one of the 5 categories. I have chosen 3 from Leadership Development this month.

- Becoming by Michelle Obama
 Her memoir tells of the experiences that shaped her from her childhood on the South Side of Chicago to her years balancing motherhood and work as an executive to time spent at the world's most famous address.
- 2) Hidden Figures: The American Dream and the Untold Story of the Black Women Mathematicians Who Helped Win the Space Race by Margot Lee Shetterly This book tells the stories of 5 courageous women who were NASA's "human computers" and forever changed the world.
- 3) My Little Golden Book About Ruth Bader Ginsburg by Shana Corey Ruth Bader Ginsburg worked hard for women to have equal rights. She was the second woman and the first Jewish woman to be a U.S. Supreme Court justice.

Program Resources Report

September is a good time to begin reading for the 2022-2023 Reading Program for United Women in Faith. The list of new books for the year should be coming out soon, as well as the years that are included in this year's Reading Program. Last year's new list was printed in the November/December *Response*. There are many good titles from the past few years for those who want to get started now.

If you have not participated in the Reading Program before, now is a great time to start. The Reading Program is for everyone – adults, youth, and children. The chosen books fall into 5 categories: Education for Mission, Leadership Development, Nurturing for Community, Social Action, and Spiritual Growth. Response magazine and the Faith Talks podcasts are part of the Reading Program. Go to umwmissionresources.org for more information. There are 4 plans to choose from.

- Plan 1: Read 5 books one book from each category and *response* magazine.
- Plan 2: Read 10 books two from each category and *response* magazine.
- Plan 3: Read 15 books 2 from each category, 5 additional books from any category, and *response* magazine.
- Plan 4: Read 20 books 2 from each category, 10 additional books from any category, and *response* magazine.

The new Program Resource (Program Book) is available for order. It is entitled *Mosaic of Faith – We Are All Part of God's Story*. The programs are based on *Mark* 8:27-30 and invite us to reclaim and explore our identity as children of God and as a community of Women of Faith. Monthly *Bible* studies, reflections, program activities, and weekly activities to do on you own are included.

The Program Resource is available for \$14.99 in print and digital options. If you purchase a physical copy, you may add the digital Program Resource for only \$5. (A special promotional link will follow upon completion of your order of the physical book).

I will be glad to order these Program Resource books for the units to save money on shipping. I will send off an order around September 20. You may also order books directly from umwmissionresources.org.
