
Tech Tip: Create a safe password. Don't use your name, pet, birthday, or other personal information for a password. Here's a method to create a safe password:

- 1. Make up a sentence: example: My #1 ice cream shop is in Rock Hill.
- Use the 1st letter of each word, capitalize proper initials, use numerals & symbols: M#1icsiiRH

Easy. You can make up any sentence: use an old address, a favorite (#1), a memory, etc. These symbols can usually be used: !, @, #, \$,%,&,*,? Other symbols may be used depending on the site. There are other password-writing methods but this one works for me. Another tip: write it down somewhere safe. Don't use the same password for every site.
