

#### **President's Report**

#### South Carolina Conference United Women in Faith-President - Mission Echo - September 2022

This edition holds much information as our South Carolina Conference United Women in Faith officers continue to perform the duties of their positions and so much more! I am truly grateful to each officer and the work they do. Be sure to read about their projects, register for events and provide prayer for all our activities. Kindly remember all the behind the scenes members who create our newsletter and bring our virtual events to life. Our gifts and talents serve best when shared with others. We have many to share and do so joyfully as United Women in Faith!

Our return to in person activity began with **Assembly**, May 20-22. Our South Carolina Conference had 73 members involved with Assembly. We had 50 attend the Orlando, Florida event, 22 participate virtually and one member make a donation to Assembly. Several of our attendees were first timers, while many had experienced Assembly before. The theme "Turn It Up" was emphasized with inspiring speakers, hand clapping foot stomping music, moving videos, engaging workshops and informative explanations of our United Women in Faith name and our many new programs. Look for articles in <u>response magazine</u> which capture speakers and interviews with musicians, and Bible study leaders. All are encouraged to make plans now for Assembly 2026 located in Indianapolis, Indiana.

A virtual **Come Together Be Together** on Saturday June 25<sup>th</sup> with theme "Surrounded by Love" had 200 registered guests. South Carolina Conference United Women in Faith Membership Nurture and Outreach Committee, chair Angela Allen with hosts Charleston District United Women in Faith, Jeanette Alston district president and the Aldersgate United Methodist Church United Women in Faith, unit president Pat DuBois created a lively, spiritual morning for all. With over 130 online we heard greetings from Pastor T, Rev. Telley Gadson, sharing her morning with us and bringing greetings from Bishop Holston as our Cabinet Representative. Her dedication to connect with us that morning was especially heartfelt as her family was experiencing a sudden tragic loss. Our mission minded speaker Rev. Debra Dowdle of Goose Creek United Methodist Church spoke of the love and support she has experienced in her life. She reflected upon times when prayers of love encouraged her. Our four workshops provided unique fun activity or Bible message continuing on the theme. This lively, loving, fun morning together was shared by all who were on camera wearing hearts, the color red and large smiles.

The Limitless Event July 1<sup>st</sup> brought together our young United Women in Faith. Limitless mentor Debra Schooler, Columbia District President, and Samoria Session, Limitless member and Program Advisory Group representative prepared a program designed for our youth. Presentations on preparing healthy snacks (cranberry oatmeal bars) and planting wild flowers demonstrated by Terri Sumpter, Clemson Education along with safety tips from Richland County Sheriff's Office made for a fun and informative morning. A separate workshop for the 4 Limitless aged attendees was led by Samoria while Debra hosted 21 adults in discussion of ways to reach our Limitless aged, 14-30 young women. A fun virtual scavenger hunt completed the morning event. The next Limitless Event is December 3 with more details to come.

Mission u returned to in person learning at Spartanburg Methodist College on July 21-23. Dean Vanessa Key and Assistant Dean Michelline Williams, the South Carolina Conference United Women in Faith Mission u Committee, study leaders, youth leaders, golf cart drivers, many volunteers and Spartanburg Methodist College hosts composed a fabulous event. Theme "Who Can We Be Together? Building Communities of Hope and Joy" brought 103 students to campus for study, conversation and group learning. Our inspiring plenaries, engaging music led by Craton Dicks, self-guided Prayer Room, display tables, bountiful Craft Room (sales totaling \$1,366.25 for missions), awarding Bess Dowling Ware Scholarships, 50 Year Golden Memories Celebration and Fashion Show (with 50 year party cake at dinner), Bishop Holston's message, Limitless performance, Dr. Regina Moore of SC Christian Action Council, Communion service and more composed a robust agenda and exciting time to be on campus. Our closing offering and donations along with Craft Room sales provided \$989.25 to each of our four SC mission projects. We are immensely thankful to our Registrar Charm Eaddy and Assistant Registrar Vikki Hill who tirelessly and flawlessly managed our coming and going, keys to dorm

rooms, class assignments, answering questions all with broad smiles and grace. Every district had participants on campus, all excited to return to be together for Mission u.



Thanks also to those who collected the many handmade goodies and brought them from the crafters hands to our Spartanburg Methodist College Craft Room. We had some deliveries arrive before we did! Your support was strong! We are grateful.

Volunteer leader Jane Scott, Killingsworth representative, Jan Fleming Bethlehem Center, Spartanburg representative and many District Education & Interpretation Mission Coordinators Damita Bridges, Katherine Sabb-Graham, Donna Hopkins, Tonya Mack, and Barbara Wright, worked together to provide a successful Craft Room. They set up, organized, priced, bagged and encouraged strong sales. Appreciation goes to Sarah Woods, Marion District President for delivery of unsold items to Wallace Family Life to stock their student Christmas Shop.

Sales from the Craft Room totaled \$1,366.25. Along with the Saturday offering and some additional donations a resulting figure of \$989.25 was provided to each of our four mission projects. This community of women is amazing! Thanks to all.

We continue to collect pull tabs and used postage stamps. #### Greetings from Killingsworth!

As we celebrate 75 years in mission at Killingsworth I think of the dozens of women who have come to us for hope and healing through these years. They all have a story. We never use their actual names as we tell stories – but –

Brenda spent much of her childhood alone. Her mom would leave her for hours – even days – simply telling her to "be a big girl". Brenda had no concept of what it was to be a big girl, so she made some bad choices. She gave birth to two little girls and did not know how to parent them. Her bad choices eventually took her to prison. When she was released, she was ready to find out what it was like to really be a big girl. Killingsworth accepted her as a resident. Over time, she learned that big girls get jobs and establish good work histories, they go to meetings to help them understand and cope with a clean life – they rent apartments, pay for utilities and food – and more.

Brenda's biggest accomplishment is that she is now a good role model for her daughters – letting them see that big girls become productive women.

Amber was an alcoholic married to an alcoholic. Even though the husband could do it, Amber could not drink and hold a job. She realized that she had to get away and get treatment but leaving her childhood sweetheart turned husband was a hard thing to do. She got sober and saw that a sober life was a good life – she got a good job with benefits, and she saved enough money to buy a car. All was going well – until her husband called and begged her to come home. He promised that he would stop drinking as soon as she got home. She went back and she soon learned that she was addicted to him as well as to alcohol. With this realization she returned to Killingsworth to start over – conquering two addictions this time.

After years of abuse and marital rape Angie left her marriage and took her two children with her. While living in her car they were discovered, and the children were taken away to foster care. And then Angie realized that she was pregnant once again – a result of marital rape.

Angie attempted suicide and was discovered and taken to a hospital. When she was dismissed, she went to Killingsworth as an indifferent, lethargic woman. The hospital had restored her physical life and then, at Killingsworth, God worked to restore her hope of sense and self.

She left Killingsworth just in time for her baby to be born and then went to the home of a longtime Killingsworth supporter where she and the baby stayed until she could get her own place. She lost touch with our staff for a few years- then we found her.

She had gone back to school for LPN training, regained custody of her two older children and married a man who was good to her and her children – and he realized that he was a lucky man to have found this family. Quoting a former staff member "that is a great return on an eight-month investment, a mustard seed investment. But Killingsworth is all about planting seeds and having faith in God's merciful capacity to give our lives back to us as a gift."

Your support of Killingsworth has planted numerous seed through these years. We thank God for the lives that have been restored to produce good fruit resulting from cultivating these seeds.




