Debra Schooler - President

I have been busy this quarter. We had our April and May executive meetings. I am excited about all we can do and all we are doing. Columbia District is the best. I have been working with the conference Charter for Racial Justice event: "The Struggle for Equitable Access to Safe Water". This event will be by Zoom on June 24th. Sharee and Rhonda have sent the info out to all. Please register and attend this critically important meeting. "As United Methodists we are called to participate in God's creation through acts of personal, social, and civic righteousness. Proclaiming and modeling a new lifestyle rooted in stewardship and justice, we work toward the day when all God's children respect and share in the goodness of creation". Quoted from Patricia Armstrong.

I went to a day of Prayer at Mt. Hebron on May 5 and listened to three great speakers on how to Pray. It was very inspirational, and I will share more at our meeting.

I thank Carrie for standing in for me at the Come Together Be Together virtual meeting on May 20. Angela Allen, our conference MNO leader, was very impressed by Carrie and the wonderful job she did for the meeting. Thank you, Carrie.

I met with several of our Cluster leaders, and they are working hard to reach out to their churches and identify the leaders in the units of the active churches. We are hoping to update our officer list with all the circle and

unit leaders in our district. If a unit is not active, they will offer a suggestion to meet with another unit so they can still be involved. This will be an ongoing job, since a lot of our units and circles do not meet in the summer.

I also had my first experience as a delegate to the Annual Conference. What a year to experience my first conference. It was very informative, and I learned a lot. I felt sad that 113 churches are disaffiliating from the UMC, but I know that going forward, we will continue to serve our sisters in Christ and the marginalized in our world. I talked with several of our United Women in Faith sisters, and they are changing churches to attend a church that is not disaffiliating. I know that some of our sisters would like to continue in the United Women in Faith, so we need to work on how we can make this happen.

Carrie R. Murray – Vice President

Church Women United of Columbia held its Annual May Friendship Day Celebration May 5, 2023. Special recognition was given to two young church women from the United Methodist Church Denomination for living out the gospel message in their home, church, community, and place of business. Anna Schafer from Cayce UMC and Ayanna White from Francis Burns UMC were honored with the *Church Women United of Columbia Outstanding Young Church Woman Award for 2023*.

Francis Burns United Methodist Church in conjunction with Power in Changing sponsored a community Drive-Through Baby Shower May 13, 2023. Churches and agencies throughout the Columbia area donated diapers and other baby items and Francis Burns' United Women in Faith prepared Mother's Day gift bags that included personal care items and books donated by Richland library. We serviced over 50 mothers with small children. The event was a gigantic success.

South Carolina Conference United Women in Faith sponsored the annual *Come Together Be Together* fellowship May 20, 2023, hosted by the Columbia District with Virginia Wingard UMC serving as the host church and Carrie R. Murray serving as the official greeter who also introduced Retired Elder Rev. Mary L. Johnson, the keynote speaker who addressed the theme: *Get Hope. Be Hope.* The 115 participants had a choice of four fun and informative workshops to attend. Our time together was outstanding!

The United Methodist Church 2023 South Carolina Annual Conference was held in person June 4-7, 2023, at the Florence Center in Florence, SC. Conference theme: *Seeking A More Excellent Way: Breathe and Believe, Hewing Hope!* The Annual Conference was hosted by the Florence District and Highland Park UMC. The work of the conference included, but not limited to the following: (1) passed resolutions to oppose the death penalty and gun violence; (2) remembered 49 clergy and spouses; (3) commissioned or ordained 22 candidates; (4) licensed 31 new local pastors; (5) closed 3 churches; (6) approved the separation of 113 churches, 6 from Columbia District; (7) announced the election of three bishops, to include Dr. Robin Dease - North Georgia Conference of the UMC; (8) announced ministerial appointments.

We pray for the success of the churches that have disaffiliated from the United Methodist Church as well as those churches that remain in the denomination. God is still in control.

Lexie Chatham – Social Action

The Racial and Environmental Justice Online Workshop will be held on Saturday, June 24, 2023, at 10:00am. This virtual workshop will promote our awareness of an issue closer to home. Earlier this year the United Women in Faith learned about a water crisis in Jackson, Mississippi, but did you know there are also water concerns for communities of color in South Carolina? A speaker from the South Carolina Environmental Law Project will help us become aware of our local problem and suggest ways to intervene or advocate in these

instances. Viewing this new event earns credit toward your unit/circle's Diamond Unit Certificate from the SC United Women in Faith Charter for Racial Justice Committee.

I also sent out information concerning Social Action projects sponsored by our local churches. For instance, Francis Burns UMC held a drive through baby shower on May 13, 2023, in celebration of Mother's Day. Items collected from this event were distributed to needy individuals in the community. Washington Street United Women in Faith had a similar project earlier this year.

In addition, I emailed information about projects in which our Columbia District United Women in Faith units may want to participate. One such was the Native American Elder Basket Ministry which collects staple food and personal hygiene items as well as cleaning supplies to be distributed among that community. Whaley Street UMC was among churches that gave several baskets to this effort this year in honor of Native American Sunday on April 16, 2023.

As always, I'm sure there are many other worthy social, economic and/or environmental projects being done by our local United Women in Faith units/circles in the Columbia District. Social Action Coordinator Report

A Racial and Environmental Justice Online Workshop was held on June 24, 2023. This seminar resulted from the UWF Campaign in February to provide safe drinking water to children in Jackson, MS. That prompted the realization that there are some communities of color here in SC with similar toxic water problems. Speakers from the SC Environmental Law Project discussed their efforts in these communities and explained how UWF sisters may participate.

Still of concern, the National UWF is continuing to emphasize two priorities. The School to Prison Pipeline Project affirms the UWF commitment to ending mass incarceration and criminalization of individuals in communities of color. Also, Just Energy 4 All addresses our stewardship, duties and responsibilities involving climate justice. Recently the AARP held a seminar entitled "Standing Up to Elder Financial Exploitation." This workshop featured speakers SC Attorney General Alan Wilson and Paul Greenwood, a former California Deputy District Attorney specializing in financial scams among the elderly. Greenwood explained that the effects of these actions may be devastating and that many victims don't realize what happened until it's too late since red flags and clues may be hard to spot. AARP's website at aarp.org/fraudwatchnetwork contains a lot of helpful information if elder financial exploitation is suspected. To report these cases in SC, you can call (888)227-3487.



As churches submit their Social Action reports, I am encouraged by all the mission activities being done in the Columbia District. The following are examples of outreaches by Brookland UMC in West Columbia as explained by UWF sister Vikki Hill.

"On the second Saturday we have our community meal called "Loaves and Fishes". We usually serve between 60-75 meals. We deliver lunch to our home bound members and open the doors to the community for lunch and fellowship. We also provide take-out for those who prefer not to stay.

On the fourth Saturday of each month, we have (what started as an all-men's ministry but now is open to the women as well) "4th and goal". We serve brunch (and more), always have a wonderful speaker, and then follow with "break out" groups for smaller group discussions. The number of people attending is growing and at the last gathering there were about 60 in attendance."

I'm sure there are many other worthwhile social, economic, and environmental projects local UWF units participate in within the Columbia District. Let's share our ideas and involvement with our UWF sisters. I'd love to pass this information along, but I will need your help to do so. Please email me with a short write up about what your unit is doing and remember to include the contact information of the Social Action Coordinator for your local unit. My goal is to help our Columbia District UWF members educate themselves about the issues impacting themselves and their neighbors, while suggesting ways that they may make a difference in their communities.

Program Resources Report

September is a good time to begin reading for the 2023-2024 Reading Program for United Women in Faith. The list of new books for the year should be coming out soon. The new list is usually printed in the November/December *Response*. Those who want to start reading now can find many good titles from the past years.

If you have not participated in the Reading Program before, this is a good time to start. The Reading Program is for everyone – adults, youth, and children. The chosen books fall into 5 categories: Education for Mission, Leadership Development, Nurturing for Community, Social Action and Spiritual Growth. Response Magazine and the Faith Talks podcasts are part of the Reading Program also. Go to uwfaithresources.org for more information.

There are 4 plans to choose from:

Plan 1: Read 5 books – 1 book from each category and Response magazine.

Plan 2: Read 10 books – 2 from each category and Response magazine.

Plan 3: Read 15 books – 2 from each category, 5 additional books from any category and Response magazine.

Plan 4: Read 20 books – 2 from each category, 10 additional books from any category and Response magazine.



We did have some other significant contributions and it is a blessing that we have the money that we need for this project! God is good. And our sisters around the country who contribute to undesignated giving are also good.

We are returning to an in-person gala this year and you will find more information in this newsletter. The date is Thursday November 9th, at 6 PM and we are returning to Seawell's. We are fortunate to have Susan Sirmons as our Interim Executive Director. Susan has been a part of our support staff for years and knows our mission well. She is dedicated to the success of our work and committed to our women. Susan attended Mission u and enjoyed getting acquainted with many of you. Please make time to visit her at our table at Conference Annual Meeting in Aiken.

Our current needs include new pillows, trash bags, and gift cards. The cards can be for grocery stores or for stores where our staff might purchase clothing for women who are starting new jobs. We do have a good collection of donated clothes, but there are times when different sizes are needed.

In contrast to our good news, we do have serious financial problems currently. During the pandemic we were not actively seeking funds and now we are suffering from that. Inflation is hard on us all. We received several grants in the last year, but some were for specific programs therefore not available for day-to-day expenses. We are concerned about having enough money for salaries, utilities, and food. Our board is aware of this critical need and is working hard toward a financially successful gala, then will be looking for other funding sources.

With a new Executive Director, Board President, and Treasurer in place, we are finding some ways to use our current resources more conservatively. We solicit your prayers as we walk through a time of transition and financial difficulties. We also ask for your generous financial support as strive to keep this house viable for many years to come.

He is excited to be in mission with WFLC and is looking forward to serving. We thank his predecessor, District Superintendent Rev. Tim Rogers for his guidance and service and pray God's blessings upon him as he moves from ministry into retirement.

We are so grateful at Wallace Family Life Center for the many donations from churches, businesses, and United Women in Faith groups that have allowed us to make a difference for families during the summer months. Thank you for the housekeeping and school supplies, food, gift cards and checks which we have used to maintain the Center and to sponsor a variety of events which have benefitted the citizens of the Wallace community.

Serving children in the community has been our primary focus this summer. Led by Interim Director Linda Sanders, WFLC sponsored a Summer Camp from June 12th through July 20th. We were encouraged to have fifteen campers at the beginning of the summer. The morning routine included a time for song, ministry, and prayer. We were able to give away 30 book bags filled with school supplies to children in the Wallace area. We will soon host a second event to give away clear book bags which are now being required by schools.

With school back in session, WFLC will once again host its after-school program for students. Beginning on September 5th, the program will run Monday through Thursday afternoons from 3:00 until 5:30 p.m. Students will receive a snack, have supervised homework sessions and time to enhance skills learned at school.

The Adult Education program will also soon be back in session. It will begin on September 6th and meet each Wednesday. Attendees will have opportunities to improve math and reading skills as well as work on arts and crafts projects each month.

Our Interim Director and Board members are currently working on ideas for the remainder of our calendar year. We continue to covet your prayers as we look for ways to serve others.
