

Thanks to all who wrote letters and contacted your senator and ask them to vote "Yes" on HB3563. This was the bill that exempted sales tax from menstrual health products in South Carolina. The vote on this bill was crucial to the fight against Period Poverty that supported all menstruators in South Carolina.

South Carolina is one of 21 states with an inequitable "luxury" tax on menstrual products, placing us on the wrong side of this important issue. The impact of this tax is significant, with over 194,000 women and girls between the ages of 12-44 living below 100 percent of the federal poverty line.

Legislative Advocacy Day 2025 is an in-person event on March 18. It will be held at Epworth Children's Home in Columbia. More information will be in the next LANTERN.






Figure 2 Members delivering pop tabs to Ronald McDonald House in Columbia
