

Dawnn Flowers is one of two Assembly 2022 Scholarship Recipients. A member of the Florence District, her local Unit is Asbury of Andrews where Doris Session is the president.

THE FLAME: Is this your first-time attending Assembly?

FLOWERS: Yes, this was my first Assembly.

THE FLAME: Who do you wish to thank?

FLOWERS: First, I would like to thank the SCI Umiri officials for selecting me. Also, I would like to thank The Florence District and my local unit Asbury of Andrews, for their unwavering support.

THE FLAME: When you heard the theme – Turn It UP – What did you think? FLOWERS: After hearing the theme and watching the promo videos, I understood Assembly to be the place for faith-filled women to come together and Turn It Up

THE FLAME: Did you have an opportunity to meet women from other areas?

FLOWERS: Yes, at the many plenaries and sessions, I was given the opportunity to meet and socialize with those around me.

THE FLAME: What did you think about the sessions?

FLOWERS: The two sessions I attended focused on soul care, a new focus of the United Women in Faith and Leadership.....

THE FLAME: Did you learn anything?
FLOWERS: Some may consider this as common knowledge, but I learned the history of the United Methodist Church and how the UMW came to be. We were reminded just how Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. stated it. "We are not makers of history. We are made by history."

THE FLAME: What made you apply for the scholarship?

FLOWERS: I began attending UMW events as a tag along with my mom. She is very active in the district. As an under 40 member, some-

times, I only see the women on my local unit or district, which isn't everything that the UWiF entails. Assembly gave me the opportunity to see the UWiF on a National/International level. Initially, I wasn't 100% sure that I would be able to afford this experience, so I decided that I would apply for the scholarship.

THE FLAME: What was the "seed mission" all about? Did you participate?

FLOWERS: Yes, with assistance from my local unit Asbury/Andrews, I was able to bring several of the seed packets that were requested. One of the mission that the UWiF supports is Cornerstone..... The seeds were apart of a project that cornerstone is working on to show

youth the process of "Seed-to-Table". We were even blessed with a performance from the children of Cornerstone.

THE FLAME: Assembly is every four years, are you

planning to attend again?

FLOWERS: I knew nothing about the Deaconess/Missionaries in the UMC before attending Assembly?




