WORKING ON THE FRONTLINE - PART 4 MARCH IS WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH

Keeping Voters Safe During A Pandemic - Aurora Smalls

Aurora Smalls is the Director of Voter Registration and Elections for Orangeburg County, South Carolina, since 2013. She is the first woman to hold this position.

Mrs. Smalls has a staff of all women in the local office.

Mrs. Smalls also manages poll workers, clerks, and polling technicians, who work on designated elections. There are 17 Municipalities alone, with state and local elections, that Mrs. Smalls and her staff are responsible for.

While on this journey called life, a National Pandemic occurred, due to the coronavirus. The coronavirus has made a profound impact on the world. Changes had to be implemented to have a safe environment.



Did the Voter's Registration and Elections office expect changes to be easy or difficult? Smalls states, "The changes were challenging at times. Some changes were difficult, because wearing a mask, using hand sanitizer, social distancing, and wiping down surfaces often, was a new way of life for everyone." "The challenging task was learning how to operate new equipment in a short period of time, which helped to ensure that voters received the correct ballots and helped with safety during this pandemic. However, everyone had a positive attitude and a "yes we can spirit", on learning and adapting, thus making the process much better." Smalls stated, "My staff and I have a goal of making sure all voters are able to cast their vote, without any issues. If a challenge or issue occurs, procedures are in place for the best way to handle them." "Poll workers that did not feel comfortable working during the pandemic, decided not to work. But there were new workers who were willing to be trained and worked during the pandemic."

Did Aurora Smalls consider resigning from her position during this time? Smalls states, "No, because my staff and I worked closely together, to make sure we all stayed on task and the County Administration worked to ensure that we had the tools to make sure the voters of Orangeburg County had a great experience while voting. We had three absentee precincts with dedicated poll workers throughout the county for voters, which freed up the staff to process the request of absentee ballots and train new and returning workers on the new equipment. This also allowed me the ability to work with voters on other issues. Having poll workers and voters who were patient and understanding, and individuals that tried to follow the CDC guidelines, made voting during the pandemic a lot less stressful.

Smalls reflected on her favorite quote, "Treat people the way you would like to be treated" and her favorite Bible scripture is, Matthew 22:39, the second is like among it, "Love thy neighbor as thyself." Smalls' advice to everyone is to "Practice the CDC guidelines and be patient." Smalls did not become ill with the coronavirus. She is vaccinated and wears her mask. Smalls states, "God, family and friends, and having the ability to have conversations by phone and during video chats, helped her during this time." "God will never leave you nor forsake you."

Small's mother, Mrs. Camilla Stewart Kelly had the greatest impact on her life. "She never met a stranger and once you met her, you will never forget her. She never let her children, grandchildren, or the kids at her daycare use the words, "I can't," because she believed that all things are possible with Jesus. Mrs. Kelly always taught her children to treat people the way you would like to be treated and she believed that you should always be willing to help others.


