Staying United Women in Faith Bylaws Outline

The following are some options for staying connected to United Women in Faith even if your local church chooses to disaffiliate from The United Methodist Church.

Local unit

The president of a local unit does not have to be a member of The United Methodist Church. A local unit can stay connected to by:

- Staying a local unit and relating to a district United Women in Faith.
- Relating directly to a conference United Women in Faith.
- Joining a cluster unit.
- Becoming a district unit (in districts where a district conference is held annually, the district president must be a member of The United Methodist Church).
- Becoming an All Access online National Membership Unit.

Refer to <u>Bylaws of United Women in Faith in the Local Church</u>, Article I, Section 4: Other Forms of Units and Article III: Leadership.

Individual members

Individuals of disaffiliated units are eligible to be:

- An All-Access online national member.
- A nominee for local unit leadership in all offices.
- A nominee for district leadership (except president, who must be a member of The United Methodist Church where district conferences are held).
- A nominee for conference leadership (except president, who must be a member of The United Methodist Church).
- A voting delegate and nominee for United Women in Faith jurisdiction leadership.
- A nominee for the United Women in Faith Program Advisory Group, a national leadership body.

United Women in Faith members who are not members of The United Methodist Church are **not** eligible to be a nominee for the national board of directors.
