Note that none of the Predatory Lending Bills S0058 (Malloy 12-9-20), H3462 (Thigpen 12-16-20), or H5137 (Cobb-Hunter 3-15-22) moved out of committee. SC United Methodist Conference is a member of the SC Fair Lending Alliance (www.capratesc.com) and we will share the next steps in legislatively addressing the grossly unfair Predatory Lending in South Carolina.

The 125th Session of the South Carolina Assembly will re-convene in January, 2023. However, Committee work will continue through the end of 2022 and many Bills re-filed. You may access information about Committee activities through the same www.scstatehouse.gov website facepage.

FROM CALVARY UMC

The Calvary United Women in Faith unit has been holding monthly meetings and working on mission projects. At one of the recent meetings, the program focused on creation and how we care for God's world. Sharon Hensley, program presenter, brought plants to share with those attending.

During the month of July, the unit invited the Calvary/Oak Grove UM Charge members to join them in collecting "Wish List" items for the Ronald McDonald House in Columbia. This was the first time the unit held a mission drive for the Ronald McDonald House. The generosity of the charge and UWF members was overwhelming. The unit also collected pop tabs for the Ronald McDonald House. With contributions from members and a local business, a large quantity (16.2 lbs.) of tabs was collected.
