The Anderson District 52nd Annual Meeting was held on September 14, 2024, at Easley First UMC. The Theme was "Women in Mission, Serving with Purpose" It was a lovely day to celebrate the accomplishments of the past year, and our host church couldn't have been more welcoming and accommodating. About 50 members were present.



In the first session, we recognized four members present who are over 90 years old, and all the past presidents who were in attendance. We had a beautiful memorial service for members who went to be with the Lord in the past year, and we collected \$539 to support the Four SCCUWF Mission Projects – The Bethlehem Center in Spartanburg, The Columbia Bethlehem Community Center, Killingsworth, and the Wallace Family Life Center.

Our speaker was Meg Wilkes, Minister of Discipleship at Clemson UMC. After an inspiring message, Meg accompanied herself on the piano and sang Whitney Houston's song, "The Greatest Love of All". Gail Gorry from Clemson UMC, who is also our incoming District Secretary, was amazing on the piano before, during and after the program.

In Session 2, we conducted business such as the President's report, reading of last year's minutes, presentation and adoption of the budget for the coming year, recognition of retiring officers, presentation of the 2024 Slate of Officers, and election of officers. Past President Carolyn Briscoe installed the new officers.

Awards were given to one Unit with a 5-Star rating and 12 units with 5-Star with Gold Seal. 10 Units earned the Mission Today award, and Charter for Racial Justice Diamond Unit Awards went to 10 Units. The Reading Program saw a huge increase in participation this year. 6 Units participated with 48 members completing plans. Congratulations to all and keep up the good work! If anyone was unable to attend and would like more specific information, just let me know.





One book credit will be given for participation in Legislative Advocacy Day in Columbia at Epworth Children's home on March 18. You may choose Social Action, Leadership Development, or Nurturing for Community.






Hello Supporters of Columbia Bethlehem Community Center,


