

While I have always loved Max Lucado's books, he has hit this one out of the park! It is the story of Esther. Max has couched it as a true story of drama. There is a beautiful heroine, a wise uncle, a fickle king and a terrible villain. He has gone beneath the surface of this familiar tale and explored the characters in depth, making them relevant to ourselves.

The United Women in Faith Reading Program

Since many of you are reading and participating in our Reading Program this year, you must recognize what incredible books we can choose to read. I am going to share a little about four of the last ones I have read.

The first one is <u>Minority Leader</u> by Stacey Abrams. Any time Stacey is speaking, I enjoy listening so I thought I would enjoy reading her book. I did. It is filled with tips on leadership and plenty of examples. Plus, I learned what an accomplished woman Stacey Abrams is. Stacey revealed one of her insights to success, "I get a lot of things done because I do what I'm good at and let others shine in their roles." Her wisdom is inspiring.


Often, the Holy Spirit speaks through the book I am reading and that was very true for Church of the Wild: How Nature Invites Us into the Sacred. Chapter six connected with a relatively new part of my life and transformed how I understand what God wants of me and how I relate to His request. The entire book offered fresh ideas about God's creation and how we relate to it and what our responsibility to care for it is. In Church of the Wild author Victoria Loorz mentioned Braiding Sweetgrass written by Robin Wall Kimmerer, so that is the one I decided to read next.

<u>Braiding Sweetgrass</u> is a bonus book, so it counts as two books. It is listed in the spiritual growth category, and you choose which other category to list it. In this book, Robin Wall Kimmerer shares her journey of learning about the world of plants, first as an indigenous child learning from her elders, then as a college student learning through the scientific method. She also shares how she bridged the two. and how she works with her students to give them the wisdom of both.

The final book I am still reading. <u>Notable Native People: 50 Indigenous Leaders, Dreamers and Change makers from Past and Present.</u> When I read through the 50 names before starting to read the book, I knew something about only four of them and the fourth one I did not realize was an indigenous person. It is ironic that I know the least about the people who have been here longest and on whose land we all live.

Finally, remember that many books from our reading program are available from the South Carolina Library System and from Kindle Unlimited free of charge. You may also choose 2 Faith Talks and they count as a book. The same thing is true for Voices from the Field. Both are available on The United Women in Faith website. In addition, there are at least 3 movies on the program list: *Hidden Figures*, *Push Out*, and *The Hate U Give*.

I hope you get wisdom and joy from your reading. May it draw you closer to God.

United Women in Faith at General Conference

Reprint form: Leadership Touchpoints (A newsletter for United Women in Faith Leaders.)

Eighteen out of 19 of United Women in Faith's petitions passed the General Conference. These include calls to action on racial and climate justice, gender equity, protecting the girl child, and supporting deaconesses and home missioners. Our petition to amend the church's constitution to allow retired deaconesses and home missioners to vote as such at annual conferences failed to meet the two-thirds majority threshold by a margin of less than 4 percent.
